

#### **Polish Community Celebrates Feast of Corpus Christi**

Members of the Polish Community celebrated the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) on June 19th at St Luke's Parish in Stroudsburg. Members of the congregation had made four altars, beautifully decorated with many flowers, banners, and pictures meant to honor Jesus Christ in this sacrament of the Eucharist. After the celebration of the Mass in Polish, congregants walked in procession to each of the altars, ringing bells and throwing flower petals, and offering prayers of thanksgiving. Remembering their Catholic heritage in Poland, many ethnic groups came to the celebration in regional attire. Father Sylwester Pierzak, a Polish priest from the Diocese of Paterson, NJ, presided at Mass and led the procession while carrying the Monstrance which enshrined the Blessed Sacrament. He is one of a small team of Polish priests who come to serve the growing Polish population in the Poconos. We are happy to have our parish home in St. Luke's Church. The doors of the church are open to us by our pastor, Father Michael Quinnan, Deacon Phil Zimich and entire pastoral staff.





# Our Parish Facilities



Over the past year, we have taken care of some much needed building repairs and ground maintenance. Some projects were done due to emergency situations like the flooding of the Barrett Center Basement, the septic pumps calling it quits and replacing both the fire alarm and electricity panels. Some other projects we were able to do for preventive measures and a few others to improve the appearance of our parish complex. Through a grant award by the Diocese we were also able to purchase and install the TV monitor and projector inside the church to expand our broadcasting and communication needs.







We would like to thank those that generously contributed to our capital improvement and renovation campaign, it is finally happening! We have scheduled three renovation projects beginning in September/October and plan to complete these projects by January 2023. The front steps to the church, on Main Street will be replaced, the interior of the church will be painted and new carpeting will be installed. It was a long process of selecting contractors, waiting for approvals, and scheduling construction but it is finally here.

During renovations, the main church area will not be accessible. Parish life will continue as planned. All weekend masses will be held in the Jacques Center. Since the Jacques Center will be set up for the celebration of Mass, we ask everyone to please help maintain this setup. Parish activities are still encouraged and if you are participating in activities please return the chairs, tables etc. to their proper configuration for Mass.

The conference room in the Barrett Center will become a daily chapel. Daily Mass will be held there and will be made available for Eucharistic Adoration, silent prayer, and daily visits. Any meetings which currently use the conference room can work with the office to secure an alternative space.

St. Matthew's Parish and others will allow us to use their Churches for our funerals during this period. Please continue to schedule funerals, weddings, and baptisms with our office.
