A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR...

Jesus is with us, we are the Church, we are told to proclaim this Good News!

At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gives this instruction to his remaining apostles: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." The Church has been doing this for millennia but now the tides have changed. According to Pew Research, "the number of Americans who do not identify with any religion continues to grow at a rapid pace. One-fifth of the U.S. public – and a third of adults under 30 – are religiously unaffiliated today, the highest percentages ever in Pew Research Center polling."

Most of these unaffiliated adults do believe in God but they do not buy into Church doctrine or structure. While Pew research notes, "most religiously unaffiliated Americans think that churches and other religious institutions benefit society by strengthening community bonds and aiding the poor," they are not interested in joining. "With few exceptions, though, the unaffiliated say they are not looking for a religion that would be right for them. Overwhelmingly, they think that religious organizations are too concerned with money and power, too focused on rules and too involved in politics."

The sex abuse scandal among clergy and the Pandemic hasn't helped us at all. It has caused even more people to become disillusioned with the church and with religion. However, the command of Christ remains, and we are assured that he continues to be with us even in these confusing and deflating days. His instruction is often characterized this way: Go. Make. Baptize. Teach. We continue to be challenged with this instruction today. It is a necessary part of what we must do as followers of Christ.





We are going to begin another Alpha in February. This Alpha will be open to all – especially those "nones" who need a reminder of what it is that we believe. Alpha is not developed doctrine but rather the Kerygma, the simple proclamation on the person of Christ. We will use it to continue this mission that Christ gave us: Go. Make. Baptize. Teach. Join us for Alpha and invite someone who has stopped coming. We know that Jesus is with us. We pray that we can bring others to him as well.


