A big question for us as a couple who have raised our children in our Catholic faith and beliefs....what did we do wrong because some do not practice this and they are wonderful good Christian people? For some time it has been our belief that we are missing something...am a firm believer that we take care of our bodies and see a Doctor...why not our church for our souls. I personally have come from a parent who was divorced and remarried...never stopped going to church but they were excluded...from Sacraments, etc...so are we not judging... and will that not be the final of our God to do that judging. We have a list in our bulletin regarding sick and infirmed...pray for them...but couldn't we have some committee to at least call and see if they need anything. COVID has certainly been a hindrance...that COVID will not last but has given many an excuse or viable reason not to worship in person. Somewhere along the way we have lost the ability to connect with each other...why? Our ability to encourage more to the religious life...mainly, priests...makes me think that there is no reason to not welcome many men and women to become ordained...Our deacon is a wonderful example of a man who is married...had children...and is dedicated to his service at St. Luke's. We are not sure who has compiled all those questions that we received...and encouraged to reply. We were born Catholic. Raised Catholic...and so also for our children...and remain Catholic...but over the years wonder if we have become exclusive and not inclusive...Many friends of various denominations believe in the same God as us...let us oin in good faith those other communities. This long survey is too detailed for what should be simple...and what we should be doing every day as people of God... Lastly, let us keep a more personal contact...with each other...costs nothing but does so much to strengthen our bond with Christ...Do unto others...Faith, Hope and Love and the greatest of these is love.
