
Lent Weekday Masses





Lenten Rules of Fast and Abstinence

We are encouraged to fast during Lent as an act of sacrifice for the Lord. Fast means that we do not eat between meals, we eat smaller portions for two meals and only one main meal a day. Abstinence means that we do not eat meat or sacrifice some other fond staple if we are vegetarian. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. We may of course, wish to give up some food item, drink, or other pleasure during Lent as a way of offering sacrifice for ourselves, our Church, our world.
